Capernaum (Drama, Lebanon, 126 min., 2018, rated R).

Capernaüm ("Chaos") tells the story of Zain, a Lebanese boy who sues his parents for the "crime" of giving him life. The film follows Zain as he journeys from gutsy, streetwise child to hardened 12-year-old "adult" fleeing his negligent parents, surviving through his wits on the streets, where he meets an Ethiopian migrant worker, Rahil, who provides him with shelter and food, as Zain takes care of her baby son, Yonas in return. Zain later is jailed for committing a violent crime, and finally seeks justice in a courtroom. Golden Globe and Oscar nominee for Best Foreign Language Film.

The Favourite (Biography/Drama, USA/UK, 119 min., 2018, rated R).

Early 18th century. England is at war with the French. Nevertheless, duck racing and pineapple eating are thriving. A frail Queen Anne occupies the throne and her close friend Lady Sarah Churchill governs the country in her stead while tending to Anne's ill health and mercurial temper. When a new servant, Abigail arrives, her charm endears her to Sarah. Sarah takes Abigail under her wing and Abigail sees a chance at a return to her aristocratic roots. As the politics of war become quite time consuming for Sarah, Abigail steps into the breach to fill in as the Queen's companion. Their burgeoning friendship gives her a chance to fulfill her ambitions and she will not let anything stand in her way. Nominated for 10 Academy Awards including Best Picture.



Supplies:

Pine Cones! Collect them outside, or buy them at the craft store. A foil lined tray

Cinnamon Oil

Plastic bag

Directions:

- * If you collect your pinecones outside, wash them well and bake them on a foil-lined tray for 30 minutes at 200 degrees. This will kill off any lurking critters and will also help your pinecones open up.
- * Once the pine cones have cooled, put them in a plastic bag.
- * Add 15 to 20 drops of cinnamon oil to the bag (per about half pound of pinecones).
