
Harvest Time at the Community Garden

	Spray paint (gold and orange) Raffia Mini straw hat
	Sunflower Craft paint and brushes
	Black marker Glue
Direction	*Use your spray paint to add texture to your rolling pin *Lightly draw on your face with a pencil
	*Use craft paint to paint in the eyes and nose *Use the black marker to add details and stitch lines *Glue raffia to the inside of the straw hat
	*Cut a hole in the top of the hat and slide it over handle *Glue on the sunflower *Add a raffia bow \on the bottom handle
