



Getting a good night's sleep can get harder as we get older. Sleeping pill use is highest in people over 65 with New Brunswick having the highest rate in Canada. Medical experts recommend *against* the use of sleeping pills by older adults because of safety concerns, for example memory problems and falls. During this one-hour presentation, Dr. David Gardner will talk about how sleep changes with age and the benefits and risks of taking sleeping pills. He will also describe the YAWNS NB study, which shares information about effective ways to get a good night's sleep without sleeping pills. The session will end with a Question & Answer period.

Dr. David Gardner is a Professor with the Department of Psychiatry of Dalhousie University and is the lead researcher of the YAWNS NB project. He

has been researching the safe and effective use of medicines for over 20 years and has over 100 scholarly publications. He has been recognized for his teaching excellence and community service.

Public Service Note - For Your Information:

KATY'S COVE - AN IMPORTANT COMMUNITY ASSET WORTH SAVING

Katy's Cove is a warm salt-water beach and recreation facility located in the resort town of Saint Andrews that has been in operation for 114 years since its opening in 1907. Many residents and visitors have fond memories and have a special place in their heart for Katy's Cove. Sadly, Katy's Cove has been in a gradual decline over the last few years and has reached the point where a major restoration is needed so that Katy's Cove can not only regain its former stature but become better.

In December 2018, a not-for-profit community organization called Katy's Cove Incorporated was formed to develop, administer, and maintain a public recreational facility for the benefit of the community at large and surrounding area. By 2019, Katy's Cove Incorporated had secured a 10-year lease renewable for another 10 years for the land at Katy's Cove. Katy's Cove Incorporated also held a public meeting prior to the COVID crisis and has maintained a website www.katyscove.com to keep the public informed of developments at Katy's Cove.

Katy's Cove Incorporated has managed to raise \$117,000 through generous donations from the Kiwanis Club, Fundy Community Foundation and the public since its inception which has been used to address many of the immediate health and safety and operational issues at Katy's Cove. This work has included replacement of one of the gates controlling water levels in the Cove, refurbishment of the playground equipment, re-grading and repairing the access roads, repairing the docks, repainting the railings, treating the area for red ants, acquiring a dozen new picnic tables, and conducting two community clean-ups of the area. Through these efforts, Katy's Cove has been able to remain open and safe for public through some challenging times.

But just repairing the deteriorated infrastructure at Katy's Cove is not enough and it was recognized that more needed to be done. In 2020, Katy's Cove Incorporated approved a development plan developed by a professional architectural firm along with detailed designs for all buildings and engaged an engineering firm to provide realistic estimates of the cost to develop the property. The scope of work to be done at Katy's Cove is significant and estimated by CBCL Engineering to be \$2,234,000 and will make Katy's Cove a world-class recreational facility. The Board has set an aggressive timetable of five years to complete the restoration of Katy's Cove. This timeline, although ambitious, is fully achievable but will require a concerted fundraising effort from the Government, community groups and the general public.

To address this challenge, Katy's Cove Incorporated has applied for a \$750,000 grant starting in 2022 under the Canada Community Revitalization Fund, have applied for charitable status with the Canada Revenue Agency and will be launching an aggressive fundraising campaign.

Katy's Cove Incorporated believe that Katy's Cove is an asset worth saving and have every confidence that the people of Saint Andrews are up to the challenge. We will be stepping up our fund raising campaign in the coming months and plan on holding additional public consultations to seek input on the development of Katy's Cove.
