
## THE COMMUNITY GARDEN WRAPS UP ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON

The crops are being harvested and





Home supports may be able to help you with daily activities like cooking, bathing and cleaning to help you live as independently as possible in your home.



# Crafty Corner Edible Turkey Table Decoration

#### Materials:

. Your favourite cheese ball

2 candy eyes (craft store or cake decorating department)

1 Slim Jim

pretzel sticks

1 candy corn

a few teaspoons of melted chocolate to adhere the eyes and "beak"

Ritz crackers

#### Directions:

Prepare your favourite cheese ball.

Place pretzels as in picture to make the nice full tail of the turkey.

Construct neck before attaching. Use a bit of melted chocolate to adhere the eyes to a 4/5" piece of Slim Jim.

Glue on the "beak" candy corn. Place the "neck" in refrigerator to harden if needed.

Insert the "neck" Slim Jim into the cheese ball.

Place the entire turkey on a plate and into the refrigerator for overnight.

Before serving, arrange crackers around the cheese ball.
