Most of the plots in the Garden have been put to bed for the winter, but the beautiful weather has allowed many veggies such as tomatoes, to continue to ripen. Our new three-bin composter system accepts the garden waste as members harvest and pull up their plants. This waste will be frequently turned, will rot and become lovely compost for next summer.

Over the course of the growing season, two garden beds were set aside to be cultivated for the use of the Open Door Food Bank. These beds are managed by Community Garden member Rika Nason, who plants, tends and harvests the produce which is

then donated to the Open Door program recipients. The October harvest marked the last of six harvests donated to the Open Door Program (Saint Andrew's food bank) in 2021. The harvests

continue to be well received by the Program recipients. They look forward to the fresh produce every month and are always excited to see what has been harvested!



There are presently thirty-two garden plots in the garden, all of which have been renewed for the 2022 season. The rental fee is \$30 per plot for the season.


